

What You Need For Your ALS Disability Interview

- An original or certified copy of your birth certificate. If you were born in another country, proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency is needed.
- If you were in the military service, the original or a certified copy of your military discharge papers (Form DD214) for all periods of active duty.
- Your W-2 Form from last year, or if you were self-employed, your federal tax return (IRS 1040 and Schedules C and SE).
- Social Security Numbers of your spouse and children.
- Your checking or savings account number if you have one.
- Name, Address and phone number of a person who can get in touch with you if necessary.
- Medical and job information:
 - Names, addresses and phone numbers of all doctors and other treating sources.
 - Dates seen by each treating source.
 - Names of medicines you are taking.
 - Medical records in your possession.
 - Kind of jobs and dates you worked in the 15 years before becoming disabled.
